Find an Accessible Entrance - Level 2

Level 2: compare routes and request help



Jules uses a wheelchair and needs a step-free entrance to a center. Read this fictional entrance notice. Stay on marked open paths.

Front entrance	Closed for repairs. Do not enter.
East entrance	Open; six steps; no ramp.
West entrance	Open; step-free path from the marked sidewalk.
If the path is blocked	Ask reception staff for a safe accessible route.

Read the information. Write, say, point to, or dictate your answers. A calculator may be used.

1. Which entrance meets Jules's step-free requirement?

2. Why is the east entrance unsuitable for this plan?

3. Can Jules use the closed front entrance as a shortcut?

4. The west path is blocked. What should Jules do?

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Sample answers below. Accept equivalent wording and supported communication.

1. Which entrance meets Jules's step-free requirement?

West entrance.

2. Why is the east entrance unsuitable for this plan?

It has six steps and no ramp.

3. Can Jules use the closed front entrance as a shortcut?

No; it is closed for repairs.

4. The west path is blocked. What should Jules do?

Ask reception staff for a safe accessible route.
